

Egg Box Museum

To start you will need an empty egg box, which you will take with you into your garden or on a walk in your local area. It is important to look after your community, go to somewhere you can walk to from your home or explore your garden at home, stay in your family group and remain 2 metres away from other walkers!

As you explore we would like you to fill each section of your egg box with a piece of natural material, it could be leaves, sticks, little stones, wool, feathers, or simply whatever interests you! Please don't pick up anything that is still alive, insects and flowers need to be left so they can do an important job within their local ecosystems.

Telling a Story

When you return from your walk we would like you to tell us a story about the objects you have collected. This story can take any form you wish, it can be a picture, animation, a written story, poem, or you can film yourself telling us the story.

You can be as imaginative as you like.
